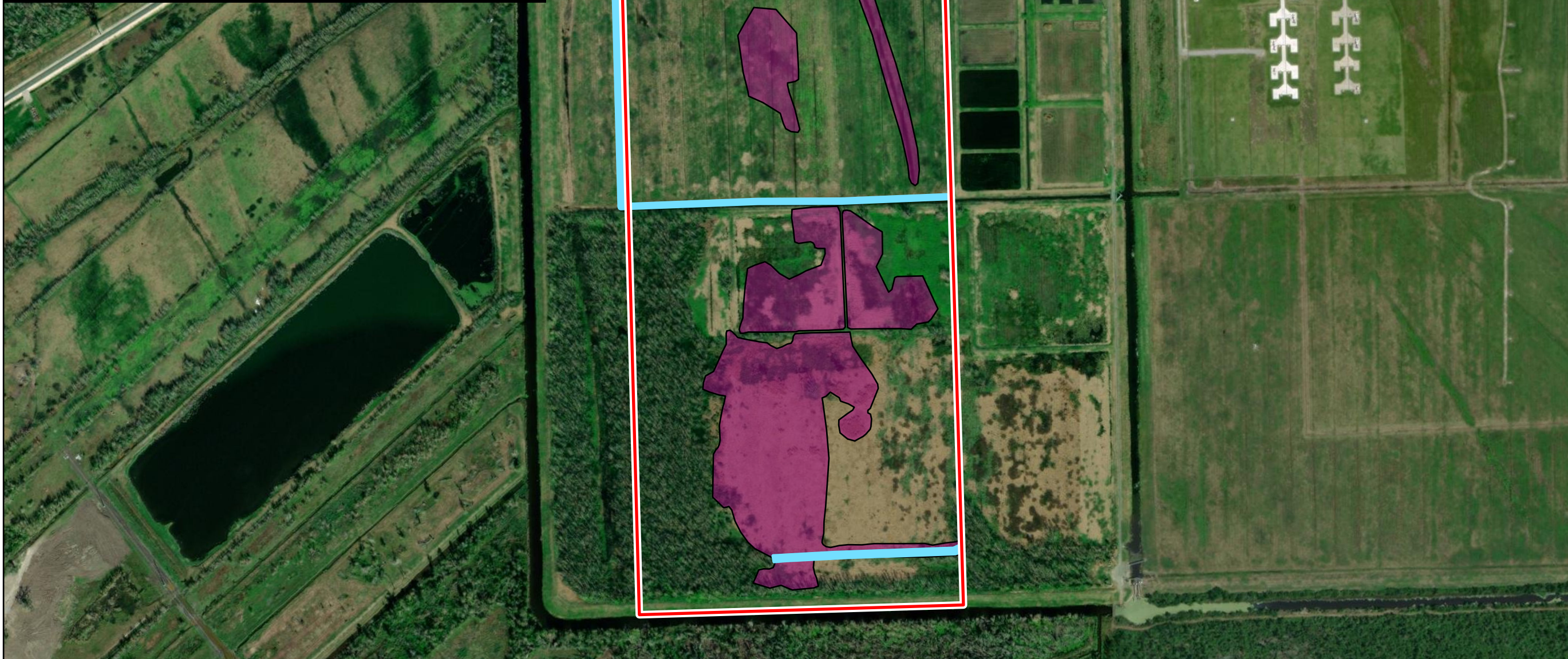

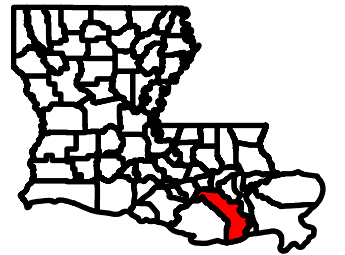

Key Site Points:

- Based on the 2024 Phase I Cultural Resources Survey completed by All Phases Archaeology, no archaeological sites or cultural resources were identified during the survey, and it was recommended no further cultural investigations are necessary.
- According to U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (UASCE) documentation from 2000, all of the of the wetlands and waterways within the Larose to Golden Meadow Hurricane Protection Project have been mitigated.
- Since the wetlands and waterways are under the jurisdiction of the USACE, a permit is still required for the deposition of fill material and structures in wetlands and waterways, but no mitigation will be required once a permit is issued.
