We acknowledge receipt of your letter dated 12 August 2019 and one copy of the above referenced report that was submitted as Due Diligence. This letter is for preliminary, informational purposes only and does not constitute consultation or agency coordination with our Office as defined in 36 CFR 800: "Protection of Historic Properties" or by any state regulatory process. Consultation with the State Historic Preservation Office is not a substitution for consultation with Tribal Historic Preservation Offices, other Native American tribes, local governments, or the public. We have completed our review of this report and have the following comments to offer.

If the proposed project were to require federal permits, licenses, funds, loans, grants, or assistance for development, we would recommend to the federal or state agency or agencies that sites 16CU207, 16CU208, 16CU209, and 16CU210 are not eligible for nomination to the National Register of Historic Places, and that no historic properties have been identified in the Certification Boundary. We do not recommend additional cultural resources survey or investigation.
