Dear Ms. Zelenka:

Reference is made to your request, on behalf of GNO, Inc., for a U.S. Army Corps of Engineers' (Corps) jurisdictional determination on property located in Section 31, Township 6 South, Range 7 East, Tangipahoa Parish, Louisiana (enclosed map). Specifically, this property is identified as a 14-acre site known as Cross Point North.

Based on review of recent maps, aerial photography, soils data, and the delineation report provided with your request, we have determined that the property consists entirely of uplands and features that are not subject to Corps' jurisdiction. The approximate limits of the uplands and non-jurisdictional features are designated in green and purple, respectively, on the map. A DA permit will not be required for activities in these areas.

The delineation included herein has been conducted to identify the location and extent of the aquatic resource boundaries and/or the jurisdictional status of aquatic resources for purposes of the Clean Water Act for the particular site identified in this request. This delineation and/or jurisdictional determination may not be valid for the Wetland Conservation Provisions of the Food Security Act of 1985, as amended. If you or your tenant are USDA program participants, or anticipate participation in USDA programs, you should discuss the applicability of a certified wetland determination with the local USDA service center, prior to starting work.

You and your client are advised that this approved jurisdictional determination is valid for a period of 5 years from the date of this letter unless new information warrants revision prior to the expiration date or the District Commander has identified, after public notice and comment, that specific geographic areas with rapidly changing environmental conditions merit re-verification on a more frequent basis.

If you object to this approved jurisdictional determination, you may request an administrative appeal under Corps regulations at 33 C.F.R. 331. Enclosed you will find a Notification of Appeal Process (NAP) fact sheet and Request for Appeal (RFA) form. If you request to appeal this determination, you must submit a completed RFA form to the Mississippi Valley Division Office at the following address:

In order for an RFA to be accepted by the Corps, the Corps must determine that it is complete, that it meets the criteria for appeal under 33 C.F.R. part 331.5, and that it has been received by the Division Office within 60 days of the date of the NAP. Should you decide to submit an RFA form, it must be received at the above address by April 2, 2021.

It is not necessary to submit an RFA form to the Division office if you do not object to the determination in this letter.


