This letter report will serve as our company's response to the request of CSRS for a desktop review of cultural resources within the above 19-acre parcel known as the Lafayette School Board NW Business Site. The tract is rectangular in configuration and lies in Section 16, T11S, R5E, at approximate coordinates of -91.972W, 30.086N (See attached aerial map). This review documents the known cultural and archaeological resources within the tract, as determined by the State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) database, and suggests the potential existence of unknown resources within the site. Any tract may contain incidental (e.g., road trash) cultural materials or isolated items that are unrelated to any meaningful context. Therefore, this review will employ the four criteria considerations used by National Park Service Bulletin 15 to assess significance. To be significant, a cultural property must (a) be associated with important historical events; (b) be associated with the lives of significant people; (c) embody the distinctive characteristics of a type, period, or method of construction, or represent the work of a master, or represent a significant and distinguishable entity whose components may lack individual distinction, or (4) yield or be likely to information important in history or prehistory (NRHP Bulletin 15, 1995). The first three criteria usually pertain to standing structures, while the final criterion relates to archaeological sites.

Thus, what will be considered herein in terms of the existence of cultural properties will be those properties that meet at least one of the above four criteria of significance.

Recorded Cultural Resources

There are no recorded cultural resources within this tract, as determined by the SHPO database.

Previous Cultural Resources Investigations

There have been no recorded cultural resources investigations within this tract, as determined by the SHPO database.

Topographic Maps

Historic topographic maps indicate that during the span covered by the maps (1939-2015), one structure was present in the tract. This structure was located ca. 100 ft south of Almonaster Rd., in the northern half of the tract (St. Martinville, LA 1939 62,500" USGS topographic map). The structure is not shown on any subsequent map, the next available map dating to 1957 (St. Martinville, LA 1957 62,500" USGS topographic map).

Visual Area of Potential Effects (APE)

Within a 1000 ft radius of the perimeter of the tract, there are no known NRHP-eligible properties. The Southside High School complex on Southside Stadium Rd, adjacent to the northern boundary of the tract, on the north, was constructed within the last ten years, according to Google aerial imagery. The subdivision adjacent to the tract on the NW (Almonaster x LaRivierre Rds) consists of houses that date from the late 1970s and 1980s (Zillow.com). Most are ranch-style and some appear to be trailer homes. From Google Street View, none would appear to be eligible for the NRHP. The subdivision adjacent to and on the NW of these houses lining Almonaster and LaRivierre Rds, was constructed in the mid-2000s. Just to the SW of the intersection of LaRivierre Rd and Chemin Metairie Pkwy, is a cluster of structures consisting of trailer homes and corrugated metal buildings. The principal structure is said to date from 1990 (Redfin.com). None of these buildings would appear to be NRHP-eligible.

Probability of Significant Cultural Resources

It is judged that, based on the fact that the flat topography makes much of the tract low probability in terms of significant cultural resources. There was once one structure present in the area as early as 1939, but not present by 1957. While it is remotely possible the deposits associated with this structure could be significant culturally, this writer thinks that possibility unlikely, on the basis that there is nothing to suggest that deposits associated with this structure would not be redundant and hence ineligible for nomination to the NRHP under Criterion D (Information Potential). It is therefore suggested that there are unlikely to be significant cultural resources within this tract.

Recommendations

Based on the above, no cultural resources survey is recommended for this tract.

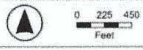
